We are so glad you have chosen to worship with us today.

One of the great gifts of the Christian life is that it is not a one-and-done destination but a life-long journey. Throughout our life of faith we are given opportunities to learn and to grow, to fail and to try again, to fall off and to start anew. It is never too late to get serious about your faith.

Today in our worship we will celebrate Confirmation, which is the sacramental rite through which we recognize those who have decided to make a new start in their faith. It's never too late to get serious about your faith, and our Confirmands are here to show us the way. I hope you'll join them.






